Astonishing Achievements by Our Students Continues

There can be no doubting over recent weeks that the students at our great school have been riding high on the crest of a wave.

of our athletes are heading to State finals and the 'Maths Engineering' TOM team was awarded Honours at Shepparton.

The debating team is deep into regional finals, and the production, 'Country Roundup' received glowing praise .

It sure has been a remarkable run and just when you think we've had our lot, and the tide must turn, we're off again.

This week, NAPLAN results are lapping at our doorstep, and the achievements of students in Grades 3 and 5, are in a word, exceptional.

An astonishing 94% of our Grade 3 students have been placed in the top 3 bands for Writing. Their averaged score as a group places them massively above the National and State average, and at the very top of the tree for schools in this area. It is without doubt the highest achievement of a group of students at North for a particular subject since standardised testing was introduced, some 20 or more years ago.

For Grade 5 students the news is just as encouraging. In Numeracy, their averaged score is substantially above the National average, and most importantly, their growth in this subject since Grade 3 is through the roof, outstripping the national expectation by the proverbial mile. 71% of our students were placed in the top 3 bands (way ahead of State total of 53%) Likewise, their growth in Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation, and Reading is way above that which is Next P&C Meeting expected throughout the nation.

In Writing, the group's achievement was in line with the national average, and a whopping 22% of our

students were placed in the top band (compared to 9% in N5W).

These results and more, are to say the least, very pleasing, and students and staff are deserving of the highest praise, for making it happen.

Its wonderful to see that programs that have been The TOM Social Sciences team and a record number put in place, as well as good old fashioned endeavour, teamwork and hard yakka, have paid off.


