HEAD LICE AWARENESS

Outbreaks of head lice are common throughout the school year. Although head lice are annoying, head lice are not a health risk. Head lice spread quickly by close, head-to-head contact. Lice cannot live on furniture or carpet, and they cannot jump or fly. There may be few or no symptoms, but itching may occur.

You can help by:

- Checking your child's head with the conditioner combing method of detection once a week throughout the school year.
- Encouraging your child to wear their hair tied back and avoid touching heads with other students.
- Treating your child's head if you notice lice in their hair. Regular washing hats and bedding.
- Telling the classroom teacher if you child has head lice, so other parents can be notified.


Creative Kids Voucher

Water Fun Day Fundraiser
