Parenting Tip:

Walk the walk.

Don't just tell your child what you want them to do. Show them.

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Parenting Tip:

Focus on Routines.

Kids thrive with a routine, so set clearly defined routines for the most challenging times of the day, like mornings, after school, mealtimes and bedtimes.

Let your kids help decide how the routine will go—do we get dressed or brush teeth first? How can you help get dinner ready?

For younger kids, write out the order of the routine using pictures or words and let them decorate it, then hang it where they'll see it every day. Then stick to it.

Parenting Tip:

Don't try to fix everything.

Give young children a chance to find their own solutions. When you lovingly acknowledge a child's minor frustrations without immediately rushing in to save them, you teach your child self-reliance and resilience.

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Parenting Tip:

Take charge.

Children crave limits, which help them understand and manage an often confusing world. Show your love by setting boundaries so your kids can explore and discover their passions safely.

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Parenting Tip:

Don't clip your child's wings.

Your child's mission in life is to gain independence. So when they are developmentally capable of putting their toys away, making their own sandwich or packing the dishwasher, let them. Giving a child responsibility is good for their self-esteem (and your sanity!).

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Parenting Tip:

Pick your battles.

Kids can't absorb too many rules without turning off completely. Forget arguing about little stuff like fashion choices and occasional potty language. Focus on the things that really matter -- that means no hitting, rude talk, or lying.

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Parenting Tip:

What you can do to stop your child's challenging behaviour.

Notice the behaviour. Do not take it personally, take it as a sign that your child needs you close.

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Parenting Tip:

What you can do to stop your child's challenging behaviour.

Respond lightly. Make a simple honest statement about the behaviour. "I like it better when you speak kindly to me."

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
