## ASSEMBLY AWARDS SYSTEM RECAP

Our awards system to acknowledge the great things students do is a tiered system. It starts with legend cards, incorporates Blue Awards then Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards and accumulates all the way to a Superstar Award.

Legend cards are awarded by staff and when a student receives 10 they are to be handed into the office. They then receive a blue award at assembly.

When 5 blue awards are collected (these can be awarded for a range of different reasons) they are to be handed into the office to then receive a Bronze, Silver or Gold award at assembly. This process continues until 5 Bronze, 5 Silver and 5 Gold awards have been received which leads to a Superstar Award. They carry over into each year.

DNPS 2025 ANNUAL MAGAZINE.


Please use texta, not pencil, as it looks better and each letter
